I look forward to the next two years working with each of you. Your continued support is essential to our overall success.



NSCDA-WV Past President Mary Hodges Passed Away



Mary Henderson Hodges, age 90, died April 6, 2023, at hospice in Huntington, West Virginia. Mary was preceded in death by her husband and best friend, Churchill Hodges.

Mary and her husband J. Churchill Hodges generously supported Cabell Huntington Hospital, Marshall University, and the Huntington Museum

of Art. The Mary H. Hodges Joint Replacement Center of Cabell Huntington Hospital was named for Mary. For years Mary served on the Huntington Museum of Art's Board of Trustees where she chaired the Membership Campaign. She organized the Huntington Museum of Art receptions, hosted gatherings in her home, sponsored exhibits, and actively planned the museum's largest annual fundraiser, the Museum Ball. She was a member of Trinity Episcopal Church, Colonial Dames, DAR, Woman's Club of Huntington, Friends of Hospice of Huntington, and the Huntington Museum of Art.

Mary was an asset to the West Virginia Dames. She started serving on the NSCDA-WV Board of Managers in 1984 and faithfully attended board meetings until she became ill in 2023. Mary was active with Cabell County Town Committee, she represented the WV Dames at Sulgrave Manor, was Parliamentarian, 2nd Vice President, and President of NSCDA-WV, and chaired numerous committees. As chair of Historical Activities, she created "Ladies Home Companion" for school tours and served on the board of Craik-Patton, Inc. for several years.

Cabell County Dames Have Located Two NSCDA-WV Historical Markers



While doing research for a scholarship presentation at Marshall University, Betsy Wilson discovered interesting information in a pamphlet. The information was written by Francis D. Calley in 1979 and it said that in 1921 eighteen members of the NSCDA-WV Cabell County Town Committee purchased Lot #1 in Memorial Park for \$30. At that location a huge

boulder was delivered from the New River. It was rounded, polished, and a bronze plaque was added to honor the Cabell County heroes that lost their lives in World War I. Mary Liz Emmons confirmed that the historical marker was near the Memorial Arch at the west end past Ritter Park. Betsy located the boulder with the historical plaque and photographed it.



Dixie Wilson's husband Dick located and photographed one of our historical markers in Point Pleasant. The Colonial Dames placed the plaque there to commemorate the French's claim to the Ohio River and the Ohio Valley

It is believed the Dames placed seven or more historical markers in various locations in West Virginia. The Historical Activities Committee will be working to locate all of them.
